

As a result, the Consistory Committee will be developing a "business plan" to guide the Valley Board of Trustees through the process of getting a dispensation, and ultimately a charter.

This decision is the result of a lot of work by the Board and Body Officers, but it is just the beginning. We have a long and challenging process before us. As part of our decision to move forward, we made agreements with our brothers in the Valley of Grand Rapids, to maintain our consistory ties and memberships with them for a limited time, to allow them to develop and implement plans to help alleviate the financial impact of losing a large number of consistory members.

While the "business plan" is still a work in progress, and will undoubtedly undergo numerous changes, we can report that we are working on a timeline that will cover a few years. We know that there will be only one conferral of the 32 degree in 2016, which will be Nov. 12, in Bay City. So we are planning and hoping to be ready by the Fall Reunion of 2017, but keep in mind that this is only a tentative date, and is subject to change. This gives us a 2 year window to get planned and organized, and to do that, we will need the help of each and every member.

YOUR VALLEY NEEDS YOUR HELP to make this a reality. We have gotten a great response to this so far, but now we need to start our labors. Ill. Brother Ken Cooper will be leading this effort as our first Commander in Chief, and we will be starting to flesh out the requirements for the 32nd degree. We would like to ask all brothers interested in ritual/degree work to please contact me at Johntsees@att.net to volunteer or if you have any questions. We will have more than 20 roles to cast, from leading characters to bit parts with just a few lines, but we must fill them all, and with your help, I know we can do it. Even if you are a new member, never done ritual work before, or are just nervous about participating, please step up and take a small part. In the ideal world, we should have each part filled

and have an "understudy" for each, but right now WE NEED YOU to take an active role in the "Valley of Traverse City Consistory"!

Overall, this is a great opportunity for our current members to become "Charter Members" in a consistory, (a very rare event and honor) and for candidates to become members in a "Full" Valley.
