Dear Brethren,

I am happy to report that our Spring Reunion was a success, and enjoyable one. Although we initiated only one candidate, we had a wonderful turnout with brothers from all over the state attending. Brothers John Hansen, Tony Lake, and Archie presented a very great lunch and a truly wonderful dinner of smoke brisket, which was enjoyed by all. Congratulations once again to the reunion honoree, Brother Grant Sowa, 33°, MSA, Treasurer. We hope you enjoyed your day as much as we did, Brother Grant, Thank You again for all you do for the Valley, and the Rite. (The fact that there was actually a small profit should make him smile)!

With this reunion behind us, it is now time to focus on more pressing Valley business. I hope that you all received my letter a few weeks ago about an upcoming meeting, to discuss the Valley of Traverse City forming a Consistory. This meeting will be held at the TC Masonic Temple on May 30, at high noon. ALL members of the Valley, regardless of rank or degree are invited, but all Scottish Rite Masons are welcome to attend. The reason we have not specifically invited other Valleys is that this is still considered an internal matter, i.e., until we make a decision, there is little to discuss with other Valleys. We will provide a cold-cut lunch, so bring your appetite with you too.

Brethren, I cannot stress enough how important this meeting will be regarding our future as a Valley. There are many reasons for wanting to get a Consistory charter, not the least being it would help stabilize our fiscal concerns. It would also make us independent on other Valleys for Consistory work. I think the great reunion last fall, with a dozen candidates, also shows us that the convenience factor, of allowing us to completely initiate candidates in all four bodies, in one reunion, should not be over-looked.

We truly need you to attend, and voice your opinions and/or concerns about forming a consistory. Your Board of Trustees has been discussing this for the past several months, and the Consistory Committee formed to study the possibility, is in favor of this action. It must be stated in all honesty, that while the final decision will be made by the Board of Trustees and Valley Officers, they all recognize that without the support and commitment of the general membership, it would be fruitless to proceed. We have debated the pros and cons of forming a consistory, and will do so again at this meeting, but also want, and need, to hear from each of you! We will do our best to explain the process of forming a consistory, the timeframe we are contemplating, as well as what requirements will need to be met to receive a Charter. Initially, we will need to focus on being capable of competently conferring the 32°, Sublime Prince of the Royal Secret, but we will also have the 19th through 31st degrees to confer for candidates. This alone should suggest to you how much work needs to be done, and the manpower that will be needed.

Personally, I have no doubt that this is feasible. I believe that it will bring back inactive brothers who simply got tired of seeing the same degrees, and doing the same things, at each reunion. If we decide to proceed, we will have plenty of work for all. We have brought in over two dozen brothers over the last couple years, and have had little for them to do... that would no longer be the case. For us to succeed in this, we will need to ask, and expect, a lot more work from a lot more members, which it is why it is so vital for you to try to attend this meeting. We understand it is a lot to ask so many to travel so far to attend, but without YOUR support, it would be foolish to move forward on this. If there is no possible way for you to attend, please contact me (at Johntsees@att.net) with your comments, questions, and/or concerns, and I will present them at the meeting so your opinion(s) can be heard. We have set no end time for this meeting to ensure that anyone who wishes to comment will be able to do so.
